





Session 5 – PM Feedback Q3. Applicability of Skills – 100.0%

- Leverage Project Management Knowledge to solve Society's Real Problems and Help in Nation Building.




Soft Skills Essentials for Everyone

21st Century Skills need: Teamwork, Problem Solving, Project Mgmt.



III. Soft Skills Importance

- 92% of all executives say that Soft Skills are just as important-or more important-than Hard Technical Skills (LinkedIn's 2019 Global Talent Trends report)
- 92% of Deloitte's executives rated Soft Skills as a Critical Priority (Deloitte's 2016 Global Human Capital Trends report)
- 90% employers believe that graduates with Soft Skills will become increasingly important (Talent Q survey)
- 67% of all jobs in Australia will rely on Soft Skills by 2030 (Deloitte Access Economics)
- 44% of US executives say lack of Soft Skills is the biggest gap in the US workforce
- In 2015, National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) survey of employers listed "Ability to Work in a Team" as the most desirable attribute of new college graduates, ahead of problem solving and analytical/quantitative skills







Benefits of Community Service

- Community Service helps connect to the Community
 - > Learn the significance of helping others in need
 - > Help improve the community making a better place for all
- It benefits your Career Prospects
 - Help build experience and skills (communication, planning, teamwork, problem-solving, task management, etc.)
- Community Service raises Social Awareness
 - Broadens your horizons by helping you understand the needs of the society and the population you are trying to help

Community Service establishes Contacts & Friendship

- The easiest way to make friends is through activities you perform together and have fun
- Community Service helps Improve Your Skills
 - Students are advised to do community service in order to get work-related knowledge and skills including time management
 - It also increases their chances of getting a job since their community involvement creates good references for potential employers

Global Community Service Practices

India (Colleges/ Universities):

Great Lakes Institute of Management, TN (2004-present):

- Adopted 20+ villages close to campus, Mahabalipuram, TN
- Every Sunday, MBA students go to villages and perform service
- Karma Yoga Course, mandatory requirement for graduation
- USA (High Schools and Colleges):
 - All High Schools encourage students to perform community service, a requirement for good college/ university admissions
 All Graduate and Post-Graduate admissions give preference to students who have community service experience

My both sons did 300-400 hours in 4 years at a High School to get admission at Stanford, UC Berkeley, and Northwestern University



Community Service for Nation Building

India's Youth Potential for Community Service

- Assume 2 hrs/wk x 32 wks = 64 hrs/yr/student
- Statista 2021 250 million x 64 hrs/yr = 16 billion hrs (51,649 HEIs)
- Statista 2020 1.26 million Faculties x 64 hrs/yr = 80.6 million hrs A HUGE untapped potential for Nation Building!
- Make it a compulsory requirement for getting their degree
- Each HEI can develop projects in surrounding communities by understanding their issues/needs in the areas of:

Education, Healthcare, Water, Sanitation, Agriculture, etc.

It will teach students to work on real projects in a team setting and work with adults to give back and help in the Nation Building



Community Service Project Structure

- Appoint one Faculty as a Champion per Institute
- Include Alumnus and Industry Experts in the Project:
 - Expertise and Experience
 - Proven Track Record with Results
 - Can Do Attitude and a Willing Volunteer
- Determine Community Needs surrounding the Institute
- Create Appropriate Projects in Primary Education, Primary Health, Water, Sanitation, Agriculture, etc.
- Leverage CSR Resources through Industry Experts
- Set up Quarterly Review for Community Service Project Progress using Project Management Discipline
- Widely share Outcomes of Community Service Project Results at the Institute and Recognize High Achievers

Mission

- To Prevent and Cure blindness
- To provide Education and Rehabilitation to permanently blind people in India



XI.A. Blindness in India – Staggering Statistics

- Over 15 Million blind individuals in India (Accounts for 1/3 of World's blind population)
- 2.3 Million people develop Cataracts every year
- 2 Million blind children only 5% receive any Education



XIA. Blind Foundation for India Results BFI Impact so far

- Over \$6 million raised since 1991
- 250,000 free Cataract operations
- One Million adults got free eyesight check
- One Million children examined for their eye sights, provided glasses, vaccinated against Measles, and provided Vitamin A
- **10,000 Braille Kits** given to blind children
- 137 Mobile Vans donated in 19 States of India
- 15 major projects done with Rotary Matching (1 to 3 match → \$500,000)


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XI.B. Importance of Education
