Need of the Activity: Capacity Building among Community Members of adopted Villages.

Brief Description (Need/Impact/Action/Picture): Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Cell of VMSB Uttarakhand Technical University Dehradun helped rural women in capacity building among rural women for establishing their own community enterprises. 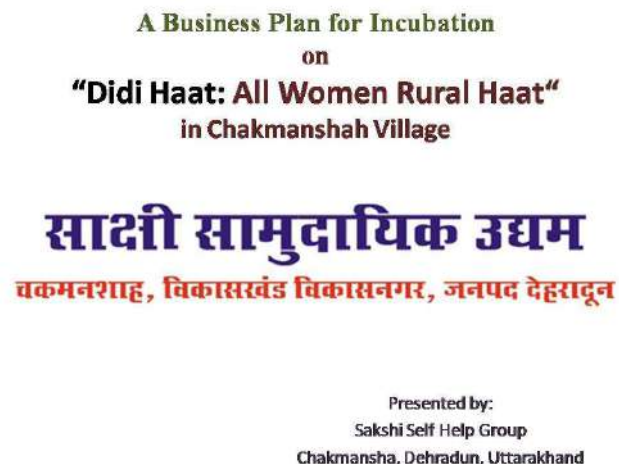

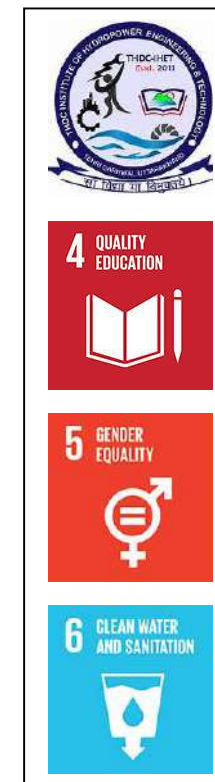

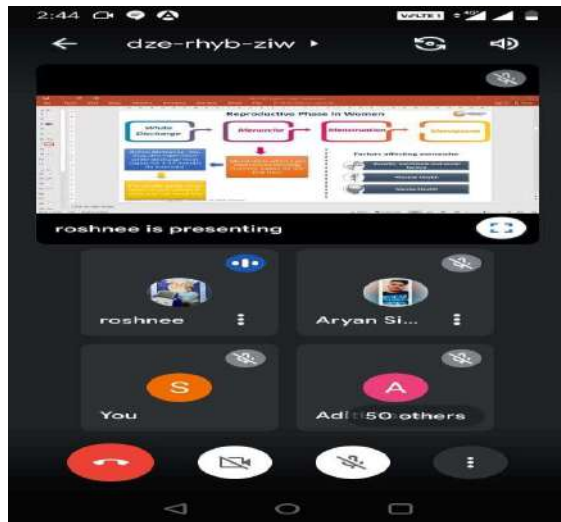


when we see women's rights as our common objective.

ACTIVITY 1: SDG # GOAL 4: QUALITY EDUCATION

Title of the Activity: THE EVOLUTION OF HUMAN RIGHTS: AN OVERVIEW IN HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

Need of the Activity: To inculcate among students the importance of human rights and to sensitize them so that they excel in all spheres of individual and collective activity which will in the long run raise higher levels of endeavour and achievement.

Brief Description (Need/Impact/Action/Picture):

"The Evaluation of Human Rights: An Overview in Historical Perspective"



The concept of human rights can be traced back to ancient civilizations like Greece and Rome, where the idea of natural law emerged. However, the modern concept of human rights was born during the Enlightenment period in the 18th century, with philosophers like John Locke, Jean-Jacques Rousseau, and Immanuel Kant advocating for individual rights and freedoms.

Human rights are essential rights that every individual is entitled to simply by being human. The concept of human rights has evolved over the centuries, and its evaluation has become crucial in understanding their effectiveness and impact on society.

This online lecture was delivered by Dr. Ashish Kumar Gupta, Principal, Shri Ram College, Jabalpur (M.P.) on 15th April, 2023. Dr. Gupta provided an overview of the historical perspective of human rights and discussed its impact on society. In this lecture he shared his vast knowledge on the various aspects of Human Right. Magna Carta, UDHR and Constitutional provision relating to human rights were discussed in detail.

The lecture helped the students and faculties to increase their knowledge on concept and origin of Human Rights, international conventions related to Human Rights and provision of The Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993. The lecture on historical perspective of human rights has shown significant progress in the recognition and protection of human right. However, the evaluation of human rights is an ongoing process, and various challenges need to be addressed to ensure the universal recognition and implementation of human rights. It is vital to continue to advocate for the protection of human rights globally and work towards a world where every individual is entitled to their basic human rights.

ACTIVITY 2: SDG# Goal 5: GENDER EQUALITY

Title of the Activity: Transgender Rights and Laws Program

Need of the Activity: To sensitize and aware the students about the concept of gender, sex and sexual orientation which will in a way fulfill the constitutional mandate of gender equality.

Brief Description (Need/Impact/Action/Picture):

“Transgender Rights and Laws Program”



Transgender rights and laws are a complex and evolving area of legislation that seek to protect the rights and dignity of transgender individuals. These laws aim to ensure that transgender individuals are not discriminated against in employment, housing, healthcare, education, and other areas of life. The laws also seek to provide legal recognition and protection for transgender individuals, including the right to change their name and gender on legal documents, access to appropriate healthcare, and protection from hate crimes.

On 11th and 12th April, 2023, Libra College of Higher Studies conducted a program related to Right of Transgender and entire LGBTQIA+ community. This was conducted in cooperation with 'Yaariyan' which is a support group of the Humsafar Trust. In this two days programme many persons from LGBTQIA+ community shared their experience with the Students and Faculties. They stressed that Heterosexuality was the norm which prevailed since so long. Due to this reason homosexuals and lesbians faced the opposition of society and law. Despite the judgments of Naz Foundation and Navtej Singh Johar, the society has not accepted them as a third gender. They further shared that the police and society sees them as people suffering from some kind of disease or highly influenced from the Western Culture. Further despite Puttaswamy's case the transgender right to privacy is violated daily. Many gruesome and diabolical experiences were shared by these people who highlighted that even today their right goes for a toss. They further stressed that after the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019 which was the result of SC's judgment NALSA v. UOI their state is still not improved and there is a need to sensitize the society so that they can live with dignity just like any other gender. Faculty of Libra College further delivered a lecture on Legal Provisions of the afore-mentioned Act and its lacunas. He further highlighted the concepts of sex, gender, sexual orientation, gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer, inter-sex and asexual and the legal protection granted by law to them.

The impact of transgender rights and laws can be significant for transgender individuals and their families, as well as for society as a whole. Access to legal recognition and protection can help to reduce stigma and discrimination against transgender individuals, and can improve their mental and physical health outcomes. It can also help to promote greater understanding and acceptance of gender diversity, and can contribute to a more inclusive and equitable society.



ACTIVITY 3: SDG# Goal 16: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions

Title of the Activity: CRITICAL ANALYSIS OF THE PRISON SYSTEM WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO DISTRICT JAIL DEHRADUN.

Need of the Activity: To understand the conditions of prisons, students of Libra College were taken to the District Jail of Dehradun so that they can have first hand information relating to prisons and prisoner's rights which will help them in their thesis and dissertations.

Brief Description (Need/Impact/Action/Picture): It is imperative duty of the State to prevent crime. Crime is a wrong against the society and public at large. Thus if and when crime takes place it is the primary duty of the State to investigate, prosecute and punish the accused. But after trial we as a society forget the convicts. The State provides a prison system to incorporate the prisoners. Jail Warden of the Dehradun District Jail guided the students as to how the prison system works. They also informed the students about the separate cells in which men and women are kept respectively. Students and faculties got an opportunity to have a conversation with the convicted prisoners and under-trials. The cells are in such a deplorable state and prison system suffers from vices of overcrowding, sanitation issues, under-trial problems, human rights violations.

The prisoners suffering rigorous imprisonment also told that they are made to do hard labour and for that they are paid. The payment received by them is transferred to their families. There is a concept of individual card in which the payment by the State Government is deposited and from that card the payment is transferred to their respective families by the prisoner. Even women prisoners are entitled to carry their young kids and there are provisions for their recreation. To ensure that a prisoner does not merely exist as an animal in the caged prison the state government of Uttarakhand has provided many recreational activities for the prisoners like music and dance. Many programs are conducted so that the prisoners can be reformed, sensitized and made aware of their legal rights. To fulfill the mandate of Constitution prisoners are encouraged to get them educated and for that a well maintained library is established by the government. Jail manuals are also shown to the students in which the students are made aware of the parole, visitation rights, and other legal rights of the prisoners.

- Guest lectures, seminars and workshops are conducted that widen and upgrade the knowledge and skills of the students and help them to nail down difficult concepts.



- The college library is the knowledge resource centre of the institution that is well stocked with wide range of textbooks, reference books and national/international journals. The infrastructure, services and facilities of the library are in accordance of new education policy (NEP-2020). DELNET (Developing Library Network) is available as an open access resource for the students to aid in effective and efficient learning through online database.
- **Activities/Actions towards achieving the goals**

- The college campus is green, environment friendly with sustainable practices in the campus. The campus has a 200-kilowatt solar array on its rooftop for generating solar energy that is being used for generating electricity in the campus.
- Institute has set up a biogas plant near gaushala with 60 cubic meter capacity that produces biogas for utilization in the mess for cooking purpose.

3. SDG ACTIVITY-(I) – रोशनबाद जेल भ्रमण

अमृत लॉ कालेज धनौरी रुड़की द्वारा SDG के अंतर्गत संस्थान द्वारा चयनित लक्ष्य Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions के अंतर्गत निम्नलिखित कार्यक्रम/ गतिविधियां आयोजित की गईं।

1. दिनांक 8 अप्रैल 2023 अमृत लॉ कालेज रुड़की के विद्यार्थियों द्वारा रोशन बाद हरिद्वार में जेल का भ्रमण किया गया, जेल में भ्रमण के दौरान विद्यार्थियों ने कैदियों आदि से अंतर्क्रिया की गई उन सभी से अपील की गई कि आपको न्याय अवश्य मिलेगा तथा आप सभी समाज में शांति



स्थापित करने का संकल्प भी ले हिंसा अपराध किसी भी समस्या का हल नहीं है। छात्राओं द्वारा महिला कैदियों से वार्तालाप किया गया तथा उनकी समस्या भी जानी गई महिला कैदियों ने अवगत कराया कि भारत में महिला बैरक की सीमा 30 महिला कैदियों के लिए ही है, परन्तु महिला कैदी 90 हैं तथा 90 महिला कैदियों को मैं केवल 2 शौचालय ही हैं तथा दो ही स्नानघर हैं। इस प्रकार संस्थान की महिला छात्राओं द्वारा आश्वासन दिया गया कि इस संबंध में वह राज्य के जेल मंत्री, माननीय मुख्यमंत्री एवं महिला आयोग को पत्र भेजकर समस्या का निराकरण कराने का प्रयास करेंगे। अंत में छात्र-छात्राओं में कैदियों को पढ़ने, शांति कायम रखने तथा देश की संस्थाओं द्वारा न्यायपालिका पर विश्वास बनाए रखने की अपील की।



2. SDG ACTIVITY-(II) - विधिक सहायता जागरूकता कैंप
