UTU Best Teacher Award and UTU Best Researcher Award

<u>Introduction:</u> VMSB Uttarakhand Technical University aims to foster excellence in technical education through quality centric teaching-learning-evaluation processes. Teachers happen to be most critical element in the complete education framework and the goal of rolling out good quality professionals can't be met without active participation of teachers.

Considering the importance and relevance of teachers in achieving the excellence in technical education, the VMSB Uttarakhand Technical University, hereafter referred to as University aims to recognize the best teachers across the affiliated/autonomous/campus/constituent institutions of the University. The university has instituted UTU Best Teacher Awards for acknowledging the unique contribution of some of the finest teachers in the affiliated/autonomous/campus/constituent institutions of the university and will be conferred every year on Teachers Day i.e. 5th September. These awards are meant to honour those teachers whose consistent efforts, passionate teaching, fairness, and commitment have not only sustained and contributed in improving the quality of higher technical education but also inspired and enriched the lives of their students.

No. of Awards:

Total no. of **UTU Best Teacher Awards** is maximum 15 for every year. There will be 8 such awards in Engineering & Technology (including Computer Applications), 1 in Hotel Management, 2 in Pharmacy, 2 in Management, and 2 in Law. However, the University reserves the right to reduce the number of awards as deemed suitable with the approval of Vice Chancellor, VMSBUTU Dehradun.

Total no. of **UTU Best Researcher Award** is maximum 3 for every year, where life-time research activities shall be honoured. There will be a total of 3 such awards in the field of Engineering & Technology (including Computer Applications), Hotel Management, Pharmacy, Management, and in Law. However, the University reserves the right to reduce the number of awards as deemed suitable with the approval of Vice Chancellor, VMSBUTU Dehradun.

Eligibility and Application: Teachers serving in the affiliated/ autonomous/ campus/ constituent institutions of the university for last 5 years will be eligible for applying through the Director/Principal of the respective institution.

- (i) A teacher who receives the UTU Best Teacher Award will not be eligible for same in next 5 years from the year of grant of award to him/her. Interested teachers will have to apply on the prescribed format as notified by the University.
- (ii) A teacher who has received the UTU Best Researcher Award will not be eligible for UTU Best Teacher Award again in whole service. Interested teachers will have to apply on the prescribed format as notified by the University

<u>Finalization of Award</u>: University will be issuing notification amongst its Institutions for inviting applications from the interested teachers fulfilling eligibility conditions latest by 10th August every year. Based on the valid applications, an "Award Finalization Committee" comprising of 3 academicians who are not presently connected with the university in any way out of which one shall be chairperson shall be recommending the names for the UTU Best Teacher Award/ Best Researcher Award. The Award Finalization Committee shall be constituted by the Vice Chancellor, VMSBUTU Dehradun. The recipients for UTU Best Teacher Award in particular year will be approved by the Vice Chancellor, VMSBUTU Dehradun based on the recommendation of the Awards Finalization Committee.

<u>Conferment of Award</u>: UTU Best Teacher Award and Best Researcher Award will be conferred on Teachers Day i.e. 5th September of respective year. No award shall be given in absentia and such awardees will be free to apply for these awards in consecutive years.

 - V. Contributed significantly to strengthening collaboration and communication in teaching community of higher technical education.
 - VI. Demonstration of community spirit and going the extra mile for others in the interactions with students and their parents.

 - VIII. Demonstration of a clear-cut idea and vision for change
 - IX. Designing and implementing actions for achieving the change
